Activities of the project so far!

2nd Transnational Project Meeting in Greece

On the 12th and 13th of September 2019, the second transnational project meeting took place in Larissa, Greece, coordinated by Jugend- & Kulturprojekt e.V. and hosted by Ke.Di.Vi.M2 Kainotomia.

Its purpose was to:

- Monitor the progress of the project by collecting the status of the project tasks from project partners and by reviewing them against the project plan
- Discuss the development of IO1: DARE Practical Guide for Inclusion, focusing on tailoring the content to suit project target groups' needs
- Design the upcoming DARE LTTA-Short-term joint staff training event that will take place in November 2019, in Pisa, Italy
- Start working on the structure of the IO2: DARE Digital Storytelling Handbook of Empowerment and of the IO3: Truth and Dare Space (elearning platform)
- Discuss the dissemination activities and update the various project plans and solve any administration, management and technical issue of the project.





Establishment of the first Project Focus Group

5 local focus groups were established, consisting of youth workers, trainers, educators, youth NGO members, staff of NGOs and youth leaders. The purpose of these local focus groups is to give their insights and evaluate the IO1: DARE Practical Guide for Inclusion and IO3: Truth and Dare Space. Their members selection was based on motivation for participation and was made with antidiscriminatory criteria and respect to gender balance and equal representation of both genders.

DARE LTTA in Pisa, Italy

From the 11th to the 17th of November 2019, 20 staff members of the partner organisations, youth workers, youth leaders, trainers and educators will attend the LTTA-Short-term Joint Staff Training event that will take place in Pisa, Italy.

The LTTA will contribute to the capacity building of the partners and will constitute a valuable contribution to the skills development of the staff members, youth workers, educators, trainers, youth leaders of the partner organization. The DARE LTTA aims to increase the learning impact of direct participants of the partner organizations and engage even more people from each partner by providing additional knowledge and training of high quality, on the themes of the project.

One very important aspect of the LTTA is that ½ of the total number of participants are going to be people with disabilities. Some will be accompanied by assistants. This target group will bring very important perspectives and insights into the LTTA, from which the partners can learn and which will be very valuable for our project process in general.

Regarding the structure of the LTTA, each partner will be responsible for one day of the activity to prepare the sessions, info material and methods according to their field of expertise
